After School Programming

Current programs evolve to support local families, including:

Kolbisen Kids/Elementary School

Fifth Graders at Hatch are escorted to Cunha via a walking bus. In a self-contained cohort, staff focus on the unique needs of younger children. Their exposure to Cunha helps prepare them for middle school.



FLAGSHIP PROGRAM

Cunha After School Program/Middle School

Tutoring, mentoring and support for milestone Cunha projects such as Historical Figures, Science Fair, and the Egg Drop for 125 students.

Teen Center/High School

A dedicated space for high school students that supports academics, college and career readiness, community service opportunities, and social connections.

When CUSD budget cuts threatened the middle school athletic program, BGCC stepped up to fund and run the BGCC~Cunha After School Athletics program.

456 kids • 33 teams • 8 sports

Remote Learning

When school closed during the pandemic, online classes excluded students without internet access. BGCC opened learning pods on the first day of school!

100 kids • 3 campuses • grades 6-12

- Strict county safety protocols
- Students had a safe, supervised place
- Students were supported for school success
- Provided human connection and physical activities



Summer & School Break Camps

When school closes, BGCC provides alternatives in addition to our traditional Summer Camp -- during Fall, Spring and President's Breaks.

46 camp days during school breaks

- Full-day, affordable care for working families
- Youthful, engaging, bilingual staff
- Sports, art, games, swimming, movies and field trips
- Grades 1-8

Trauma-Informed Practices

BGCC prioritizes physical and emotional safety for youth, families, and staff in Club policies, staff practices, and youth programming.

BGCA has the strictest safety protocols of any out-of-school program

- Annual Background Checks
- On-Site Youth Behavioral Specialist
- Staff certified in AED/CPR/First Aid
- AED devices at all locations
- Annual External Safety Assessment
- Trauma-Informed Training
- Dedicated Wellness Room
- San Mateo County “Big Five” Emergency Plans

BGCC is a safe place for Coastside youth to learn, grow, and connect with peers.

A child must feel secure emotionally and physically to learn.

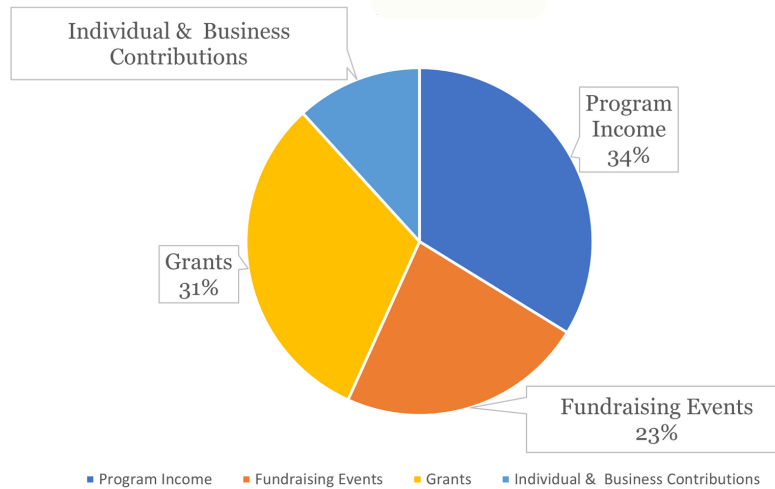

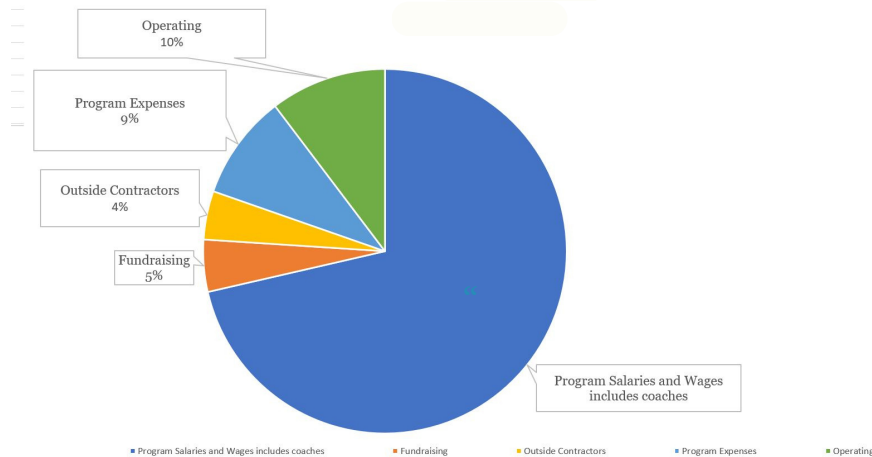
Every program is funded by donor support.

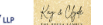
